Problem

Solution

Events

- Everyone searches the house to look for a thief.
- 2. They search outside in bushes and in trashcans.
- 3. After all the guests go home, Aunt Eater looks at the shadow behind Alfred.

Notes:

- There are two parts to the problem. It is not enough to say there is a mysterious shadow because the reader needs to know <a href="why-needs-not-needs-nee
- Event #3 begins with a dependent clause that helps the transition from event #2 to event #3. Since it serves as a transition, the routine transition words (after that, finally) should not be used. The event doesn't need to have 2 transitions at the beginning of it.
