 - ▶ By grade level, look at writing samples to see what standard each falls into, and which standard(s) still need to be covered.

- At the meeting of the building administrators and Dr. Coon on Friday, Feb. 7th, there was discussion about each of the items on the three lists being considered for budget cuts (the lists for minimal impact, significant impact, and devastating impact).
